3. KEY CORRECTIONS & UPGRADES

- **Mistake 1:**
 - **You said:** "I is lipid a lot."
 - **Correction:** "I slept a lot."
 - **Why:** "Slept" is the irregular past tense of "sleep". You do not need the auxiliary "is" in the simple past.
- **Mistake 2:**
 - **You said:** "I come back yesterday."
 - **Correction:** "I came back yesterday."
 - **Why:** When discussing a specific completed time in the past like "yesterday," you must use the past tense form "came".
- **Mistake 3:**
 - **You said:** "My favorite food was a crystal."
 - **Correction:** "My favorite food was a croissant."
 - **Why:** This was a phonetic slip; "croissant" is the specific pastry you were referring to.

4. L1 INTERFERENCE

- **Portuguese-English Habit 1:**
 - **You said:** "I recovering from the flag."
 - **Correction:** "I am recovering from jet lag."
 - **Explanation:** You used "flag" instead of "lag" and omitted the verb "to be". In Portuguese, the subject or auxiliary is sometimes dropped, but English requires "I am".
- **Portuguese-English Habit 2:**
